In-Person Program Highlights

Aktion Club Theatre of Mankato



Created a new play that will be staged in 2024 called, *The Welcoming Table*. The play features stories from the actors in the group.

The group hosted a Talent Showcase in May. 25 people shared talents and we about 100 people attend. It was open to the public.

We work with Teaching Artist Esther Hoffmann.

Zoom Box Actors

The group presented Shakespeare's *Midsummer Night's Dream* in February of 2023. 40 people attended the Zoom presentation.

There are 10-12 actors who meet weekly with Teaching Artist Amber Frederick.

Planned and participated in the 2023 State Self-Advocacy Conference- we had an informational table, coordinated registrations and hotel rooms for 50 people from around the state, helped plan the Awards Banquet and presented a workshop on inclusive theatre. 20 self-advocates and allies from the SW region participated in the event.
